

Cherokee distance medley quartet runs 10:36 in setting county record

(10:32.44); Baldwin, Pa. (10:32.49); and John Jay High of Cross River, N.Y. (10:35.65).

Also yesterday, Lenape won the sprint medley in 3:40.5, with Zach McBride anchoring in 2:01. Also on the team were LaMarr Watkins (51.5 400 leg) and Marquise Morton and Scott Gibson on the 200s.

That's the second-fastest time ever by a Lenape quartet indoors, behind only the 1992 group that ran 3:38.1. It's also sixth-fastest by a New Jersey school this winter.

Cherokee was second in the sprint medley with Joseph coming back to run a 53-second quarter and Pelerin 2:01 for the half.

Also, Cherokee's A. Spencer Davis (21-3¼) and Mayers (21-2¼) took second and third in the open long jump. Both marks were season bests.

On the girls side, Cherokee senior Michelle Bilicki won the 1,500-meter run in 4:54.0, the equivalent of about a 5:15 for 1,600 meters. Sophomore teammate Kelly Fletcher took second.

The Moorestown girls placed second in the 3,200-meter relay in 9:59.5, an indoor school record and borderline Penn Relays qualifier.

Kelsey Rinehart (2:27), Megan Hughes (2:29), Samantha Wilson (2:31) and Colleen Hughes (2:32) ran for the Quakers, who were second to Hopewell Valley.
