Brock and Tarello both medal at IC4A

BRIGHTON, Mass. — Rider University's Ron Brock and Chris Tarello both medaled this weekend in the 75th annual IC4A Indoor Track and Field Championships.

Brock, a Riverside High School graduate, placed third in the 1,000-meter run in 2:26.50, just 1.28 seconds behind winner David Brosnan of Iona.

Tarello, a Shawnee High graduate, was fourth in the 500-meter run in 1:03.75, just 1.47 seconds behind winner Sean James of Manhattan.

Athletes from nearly 100 schools on the East Coast compete annually in the IC4A meet, the oldest indoor meet in the United States.

Rider placed 12th overall. Georgetown won for the fourth straight year.

Indoor track

Rider's **Chris Tarello** (Shawnee) and **Ron Brock** (Riverside) put the finishing touches on fine individual seasons when they helped the Broncs to the Northeast Conference championship and earned All-East citations with Rider-record performances in the IC4A championships.

Tarello broke his own Rider 500-meter record when he was clocked in 1:03.75 minutes while finishing fourth in the IC4A competition at Harvard. He won his qualifying heat in 1:04.1. Before the mile relay team was eliminated because of an injury to one of the quartet, Tarello posted a personal-best :47.8 for the 100 meters while running the second leg.

Brock put up a Broncs record of 2:25.22 in the 1,000 when he finished third at the IC4As. He had run a 2:25.5 in the qualifier.

When Rider captured the NEC title, Brock shared a meet record of 3:57.72 in the 1,500 meters when he tied for first place. He also ran the 1,200 leg for the second place medley relay team. Tarello's 1:04.8 took second place in the 500 and he led off the mile relay team which also took a bronze medal. . . .

Tarello breaks own 500-meter record in IC4A track championships

Rider University's Christopher Tarello, a resident of Medford and Cape May, medaled the first weekend in March in the 75th Annual IC4A indoor track and field championships at Harvard University.

Tarello, a Shawnee High School graduate, placed fourth in the 500-meter run in 1:03.75 just 1.47 seconds behind the winner. Tarello also broke his own Rider record set a year ago.

Athletes from nearly 100 colleges on the east coast complete annually in the IC4A meet, the oldest indoor meet in the United States.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Tarello, long-time summer residents of Cape May.

Rider had a pair of strong efforts to finish tied for 19th place with 12 points as Ron Brock ran a dazzling 2:26.50 for third place in the 1,000-

meter run behind Iona's David Brosnan's 2:25.22, and Chris Tarello was fourth in the 500-meter run in 1:03.75 as Manhattan went 1-2.

Breaks Own Record

Chris Tarello of Medford broke his own Rider University mark when he clocked a fourth-place, 500-meter time of 1:03.75 at the IC4A indoor track championships last month at Harvard University.

A graduate of Shawnee High School, Tarello qualified for the finals after winning his heat and placing third overall in the trials at 1:04.1.
