Just last week, Phillips placed second at the Penn Relays with a 136-5.

"The runway was kind of short and I was basically throwing out of trees but I don't want to make any excuses," Phillips said. "Absolutely no excuses. I just didn't have it today."

The only other Burlington County winner at the two-day event was from Shawnee, which won four events at the meet a year ago. The foursome of Lauren Anders, Taylor Van Acker, Marybeth Redheffer and Betsy White placed first in the 6,400-meter relay in a record-smashing time of 21:57.91.

The previous best of 23:08 was set by Ocean City in 1997.

"Last year, we peaked a little too early," Anders said. "This year, we're trying to take everything a little slower."

"We want to keep a steady pace and PR just at the right moment. I think it's going much better this year. No one is really tired or burning out."

Cherokee was the only other team of note yesterday, taking home a pair of second-place medals. The Chiefs finished second in the distance medley, clocking a 12:58.02, and did the same in the 3,200 relay by running a 10:16.89.

"We didn't run our usual kids in the 3,200 and they did a great job," Cherokee coach Ray Bodine said. "I'm not sure if Shawnee was loading up for the race but again, for kids that aren't my usual runners and to finish second in an event like this, it's pretty impressive. It's good for the kids."

# Shawnee's Phillips continues to shine

GLASSBORO — It was the kind of performance that Lynlee Phillips won't soon forget.

And neither will her competition.

Phillips, a Shawnee High School junior, turned the Ike Willis Open into her own personal fun zone yesterday by winning a pair of events under the lights at Rowan University's football field and taking a second in another.

Phillips won the discus and shot put in impressive fashion. She took home the gold in the discus with a throw of 107-5 and placed first in the shot with a near-personal record toss of 40-¼.

Surprisingly, the only throwing event Phillips didn't win at last night's 26th annual event was the javelin, probably her best event.

For her accomplishments, she was named the meet's Top Field Athlete.

"My shoulder has been a little sore and after doing the javelin and discus, I was a little tired," Phillips said. "I really don't know how I won the shot. It (distance) just sort of came."

"When I walked back to the shot put, I knew that I had to beat 39 feet, I had one more throw so I knew I had to pull out a 40 to win. That was kind of tough."

Phillips' throw of 40-¼ was a half-foot better than the effort of Pleasantville's Amineh Butler, who placed second with 39¾. The discus was another runaway for Phillips as Overbrook's Tara Goodwine could only muster 105-9 to take second.

The javelin, though, was another matter.

The defending state Group 4 champion was perplexed by her effort in the event as she could do no better than 128-2, well behind the winning throw of Haddonfield's Brooke Durham. Durham took first with a 135-3.
