

Champions title. The others, Carol Lewis and Michelle Glover, were in the late 1970s and early 1980s.

Shawnee junior Danielle O'Reilly, second last year, won the pole vault at 11-6, missing three tries at the state record of 12-0 that she shares with two other girls. She joins Lynlee Phillips, Mandie Dulin and Liz Moore as Shawnee's fourth all-group winner.

"I wanted to win after being second last year," she said. "I wanted to clear 12 feet, but I had some good tries, especially my last one. All the best girls in the state were here, so I'm just really happy to win."

Cherokee freshman Lisa Burkholder didn't win, but she did run the fifth-fastest 1,600 in county history, taking fourth behind three Division 1-bound seniors in 5:02.80. That's only 2.07 seconds off the county (and school) record of 5:00.73 set in 1990 by Monica Olkowski.

"After 200 meters I looked around and I was in last place and I knew I had to move up," she

said. "After that, I was fine.

"This was the biggest race of the year and I put a lot of pressure on myself to do better than I've ever done."

Burkholder, who began the season hoping to break 5:40, finished as South Jersey's top miler and Burlington County's fastest in 10 years.

Northern Burlington senior Erica Davis was second in the discus at 136-2, just off her own county record. Teammate Latasha Leake was second in the high jump at 5-6.

Riverside's Rose Perry, the county shot record holder, didn't place in the shot but did medal in the discus at 129-2, sixth best in county history.

Moorestown soph Jessica Kloss was fourth in the pole vault and Burlington Township junior Nikki Zwartjes was sixth, both at 10 feet.

Cinnaminson soph Kristen Tricocci took fourth in the long jump with a 17-8¼ and Rancocas Valley senior Renee Passalacqua was fifth in the 800 in 2:14.91.
