

Brock and Tarello both medal at IC4A

BRIGHTON, Mass. — Rider University's Ron Brock and Chris Tarello both medaled this weekend in the 75th annual IC4A Indoor Track and Field Championships.

Brock, a Riverside High School graduate, placed third in the 1,000-meter run in 2:26.50, just 1.28 seconds behind winner David Brosnan of Iona.

Tarello, a Shawnee High graduate, was fourth in the 500-meter run in 1:03.75, just 1.47 seconds behind winner Sean James of Manhattan.

Athletes from nearly 100 schools on the East Coast compete annually in the IC4A meet, the oldest indoor meet in the United States.

Rider placed 12th overall. Georgetown won for the fourth straight year.

George Mason Invitational

FAIRFAX, Va. — Both Rider and Trenton State fared well at George Mason, breaking school records and qualifying for the NCAA Tournament in several events.

For the Bronc men, Jose Lopez placed second in the 400 hurdles with a 51.27, an NCAA provisional qualifying mark. Teammate Marc McKithen's 150.68 in the 800 was good for an eighth-place finish, a school record and an IC4A qualifying time. Rider's Chris Tarello placed 11th in the 800 with a 151.54.

Two Rider women set school records. Jennifer Hettel was 10th in the long jump with a 17-9 leap and Jennifer Molinelli was fifth in the high jump with a 5-4 $\frac{1}{4}$.

For Trenton State, the men's 4x400 relay team (Dan DiSanto, Marc Willems, Eric Chernikovich, Chris

Kalwinski) took third place with a 3:14.53 to set a school record and make the NCAA cut. DiSanto finished the 400 meter dash in 58.50, an NCAA qualifier, and Kalwinski had a school-record and NCAA-qualifying finish of 47.95.

The Lion women's team (Marieanne Derigibus, Jennifer Wilson, Carolyn Lemke, Missy Blaney) also took third in the 4x400 with a provisional qualifying time of 3:59.13. Blaney earned an automatic qualifying spot in the 800 run with a 2:14.10 and Derigibus posted an NCAA provisional time in the 400 dash with a 58.72.
