If the margin that the Wayland boys won by was substantial, the Lincoln-Sudbury girls put on an even more dominant display. These Warriors, draped in navy and red as opposed to black and orange, scored 149 points. The chasm between them and second-place Concord-Carlisle (83 points) was 66.

While its athletes only won four events, L-S finished near the top of many others. Junior Jackie Jarmulowicz, a winner in the javelin (116-4), also took second in the discus (93-1). "We are very fortunate to have a great deal of depth in the field events," L-S coach Mel Gonsalves said. "That's a great luxury to have." Gonsalves' field-athlete pool, indeed, does not begin and end with Jarmulowicz. Freshman Sophia Romeri won the pole vault, leaping 10 feet, 6 inches, which was also the winning height on the boys side yesterday. Finishing second in the pole vault? Romeri's sister Fiona, a senior. "When there are two kids like the Romeri's, that are so far above anyone else talent wise in that event, it's a huge boost to everyone on the team," Gonsalves said. "We feed off that energy."

On the track, Warriors junior Molly Binder won the 400 at 59.9. The 4x400 relay team also took home the trophy, winning by a five-second margin at 4:07.52.
