

Girls cross country places fourth

The Lincoln-Sudbury girls cross country team placed fourth out of 15 teams in the prestigious Brown Invitational at Goddard Park, RI Saturday. The girls ran in the championship bracket, which featured some of the best teams in New York, New Jersey, and New England.

The course was flat but muddy from the rains on Friday. Leading the scoring for the L-S varsity was Dana Jameison, who broke 19 minutes for a 5K for the first time this season, in 18:42. Second for the Warriors was Barabara MacNeil, who had a huge race, setting a PR of 19:29.

Hannah Ziobrowski continued her stellar and consistent work this season, coming in third in 19:47, the fifth time she has broken 20 minutes this season. Sophomore Jess Griffin survived a fall in the mud to finish fourth for the team in 20:07, followed by Emily Mephram, who completed the scoring in 20:11. Freshman Holly Clarke and junior Stephanie Zeytoonian rounded out the varsity effort on this day.

The JV race once again was won by a Warrior runner. Rachel Potter decimated the field coming in over 30 seconds ahead of the nearest competitor in a time of 20:12. Oliva Reed finished a strong third overall in 20:45, with Christine Duggan coming in sixth overall in a time of 21:10. Seniors Krysten Muldoon and Lauren Hardardt rounded out the scoring for L-S.

The team is headed for the championship portion of the season, starting with the Dual County League championships tomorrow at Great Brook Farm in Carlisle.
